





Dairy productions

- Dairyfarms in Iceland in total 557
- Average size 48,2 cows (2 244) 13 farms with 120+ cows
- Yield 6.273 (2.128 8.427)
- Grant for living milking cow 12,71 €/year
- Farmers gets 0,65 € for milk
- Grants for quota milk 0,25 €
 - <u>Total 0,90 € for milk</u>
 - Shop price 1,13 €
- Quata market is frozen at the momemt, (max price 1,3 €)





Constructions in dairy and beef industry

- In 2018 126 farmers got grants from the goverment to either build a new barn or make excisting barn bigger and/or better
- Most of the buildings are natural ventilated and nearly all insulated
- Mostly
 - Rubber mats in cubicles
 - Slatted floors for heifers
 - Cellar under buildings or deep canals



Beef Cattle

- Imported Angus embroys starting starting to spread there DNA this month
 - 30% of todays beef cattle are in P+ 4,79 €/kg


FOILT

- 1% goes to R+ 5,75 €/kg
- 105 € are payed from the goverment on each slaughtered beef cattle
- 48,74 €/year is payed for living beef cow



Pigs

- 10 pig farm are in Iceland
 - 3.323 adult pigs
 - 81.442 slaughtered
 - 6.796 ton produced 2018
 - Payed 3,35 €/kg (65-90 kg)
- Big plans are to increase the industry because of demand
- Ideas are to start with aktive-stall concept for finishers and spread them to sheep farms with empty buildings

Poultry

- 20 Broiler farm (1 built in 2018)
- 5,6 million broilers slaugthered
- 9,500 ton
- 11 egg farms
 - 37% free range
 - 6% access to outdoor area
 - 57% in cages (will be banned in 2021)






Horses

- 53.136 horses
- 3.075 registered owner/farms
- 1.351 horse was sold out of the country
 - Mostly to Germany and Sweden

- 7.614 slaugthered
 - 939 tons
 - 0,61 €/kg (2-4 winter old)










- 600.508 slaugthered

- If qouta will be on a free market we will see a big reduce in number of farms and the ones left will get bigger 2-3 robot farms
- The price of lamb has risen and farmers are grant for stop producing lamb meat if that works the production and price will be ok







Trends and challenges

- Plastic is something farmers use a lot of in Iceland
 - 1.800 ton/year in total
- We at RML have started a project to see if its feasible to do as many Canadians and use tower silos
